Short Chain Platform for farmers

- Custom websites for selling surplus produce
- > Set-up in less than a day
- > 57.9% recurring customer rate







Innovation 2: Bio-Based Packaging

Bio-Based Packaging

Home-compostable packaging

- > PLA materials + Evanesto® enzymes
- Breaks-down in home compost (200 days)
- > Extends shelf-life with antioxidants
- 4 packaging types developed





Innovation 3: Guidelines

Good Practice Guidelines

Retail certification system

- > 10 best practices for retailers
- Seal of Excellence certification
- Based on 58 retailer surveys
- Market-driven incentives





Innovation 4: Dynamic Labelling

Dynamic Labelling

Smart discount algorithm

- Gradual price reductions before expiration
- > Template for any retailer
- Low implementation costs (mostly in e-ink price displays)
- Maximises revenue recovery



Innovation 5: **Smart Labels**

Smart Containers & Labels

Real-time monitoring system

- Containers track temperature, humidity, O₂, CO₂
- Containers operate on a subscription-based service model
- Colour-changing labels for consumers
- Prevents unnecessary disposal
